

## Dress Code

Neat, comfortable and modest dress (*tzniut*), are part of good *chinuch*, Jewish education. Our Dress Code is intended to reflect an understanding that YCQ is a *makom Torah* where *tzniut* considerations are a primary concern.

**GIRLS:**     **Skirt length** - covering the knee. For your child's safety, please make certain their skirts do not reach the floor.

**Socks or tights** - required at all times

**Shoes** – no clogs (open back shoes)

**Shirts and blouses** - no athletic T-shirts or logos. Sleeves at least midway between shoulders and elbows.

**Junior High School** - sleeves approaching the elbow. Jackets and shirts should not be worn to cover sleeves that are too short, since inevitably, the outer garment is removed at some point during the day.

**Sweatshirt** - solids or YCQ

**EVERY FRIDAY and EVERY ROSH CHODESH** - white tops and blue bottoms

**BOYS:**     **Pants** - solid colors only. No jean types or denim. No cargo pants.

**Shirts** - shirts must have collars. No floral or inappropriate logos. Shirts must be tucked in at all times. A shirt that cannot be tucked in should not be worn to school.

**Shoes** - no clogs or open back shoes.

**Sweatshirt** - only solids and YCQ

**Hair** - must be cut to proper length for our Yeshiva.

**EVERY FRIDAY and EVERY ROSH CHODESH** - white tops and blue bottoms.

**ON ALL TRIPS, STUDENTS IN GRADES 1-8 MUST WEAR  
WHITE TOPS AND BLUE BOTTOMS.**

The Yeshiva will strictly enforce the dress code policies from the first day of school. We need your cooperation to make this a success. Since no set of rules can anticipate every eventuality of style, the judgement of the administration on attire not specifically covered in the code will be the final word. Parents of students judged to be dressed inappropriately will be contacted. Parents are requested to cooperate regarding the YCQ dress code.
